



## The Wave at Emerald Glen Park Frequently Asked Questions [www.dublinwave.com](http://www.dublinwave.com)

### Q: What is The Wave?

**A:** The Emerald Glen Recreation and Aquatic Complex is a wonderful amenity for Dublin and Tri-Valley residents of all ages. The Aquatic Complex has been named *The Wave* and includes:

- Natatorium (indoor pool) with six 25-yard lap lanes and three teaching bays. This facility is a one-of-a-kind facility. Its unique wave designed steel structure roof is one of only three that have built in the world. The year-round pool will be used for lap swimming, water walking and swim lessons.
- Outdoor sport pool for swim team and water polo (eight 25-yard lap lanes for competition and three warm-up lanes).
- Splash Zone, an outdoor boardwalk-themed water playground with a beach-style entry and interactive spray features, as well as a tipping bucket that drops water from above every five minutes.
- 48-foot tall slide tower with six thrilling waterslides, including a near-vertical drop for guests 40 inches and taller.
- Group picnic areas and three shade cabanas.
- Community Room, available for rental for parties and meetings.
- Over seven acres of park amenities including an outdoor amphitheater with lawn seating and a large plaza for events (including Dublin's seasonal Farmers' Market), and featuring new public art.

### Q: Where is The Wave located?

**A:** The Wave is located within Emerald Glen Park, at 4201 Central Parkway, Dublin, CA 94568

### Q: When will The Wave open?

**A:** The Wave will officially open to the public on May 27, 2017. The Wave will be open during the Memorial Day Weekend (May 27-29) from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM.

Daily waterpark operations will begin Saturday, June 3, through August 13 (when school resumes). From August 13 through September, The Wave will open on weekends.

Hours and dates of operation for the year-round Natatorium (indoor pool) will vary depending on swim school and fitness class offerings.

### Q: What are the admittance fees for the Waterpark?

**A:** The cost of admission is discounted for Dublin residents.

### **Q: What did this project cost and how was it funded?**

**A:** Total project costs were \$43 million. The largest majority of the funding came from development fees collected over the past decade, and \$3 million came from the City's General Fund.

### **Q: How has this project been designed to conserve resources?**

**A:** What you may not recognize when you visit The Wave is that it is built to be a green facility. The Wave was designed to meet Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design (LEED) Silver standards. The City of Dublin has taken many steps toward minimizing the environmental impact of this facility. These steps include using solar energy to heat the water in the Natatorium pool, LED lighting throughout the facility, a storm water filtering system, variable speed motors for the pool circulation equipment, drought-tolerant landscaping, state-of-the-art irrigation system and the infrastructure to install up to 10 electric vehicle charging stations. In addition to reaching LEED Silver status, there are many energy- and water-conserving features to ensure efficient operations.

Even the roof in the Natatorium, or indoor pool, is state of the art. The innovative material used is a transparent polymer which transmits more light, provides better insulation and is only 1/100<sup>th</sup> the weight of glass.

### **Q: How many jobs are there at The Wave? How can I apply?**

**A:** The Wave employs nearly 200 part-time positions including lifeguards, waterslide attendants, swim instructors, coaches, facility attendants, and cashiers.
