TASSAJARA ROAD/CAMINO TASSAJARA ROAD TO BE CLOSED AT MOLLER CREEK FOR CULVERT REPLACEMENT

DUBLIN, Calif., April 5, 2016 – A portion of Tassajara Road in Dublin and Camino Tassajara Road in Contra Costa County will be closed for an extended period of time, beginning on May 2, 2016, until December 2016, due to culvert and associated road improvements. The closure is necessitated by the replacement of a failing drainage culvert that is located just north of the intersection of Tassajara Road and Fallon Road, near the northern Dublin city limits.

Prior to the road closure, numerous traffic detour and construction signs will be put in place so that the traveling public can plan their alternate routes accordingly. Signs will be placed near I-580 interchanges in eastern Dublin, along Dublin roadways, and in strategic locations in San Ramon, Danville, and unincorporated Contra Costa County. Drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians will be unable to use Tassajara Road/Camino Tassajara to travel between Dublin and the San Ramon/Danville area for the duration of the work, and will need to use alternate routes. Alternative routes include both Windemere Parkway and Bollinger Canyon Road.

While through traffic along the roadway will not be permitted, local residents will be able to access their properties from the north. Emergency responders and other service providers have been notified and will be prepared to provide services during the road closure.

The aging culvert in need of replacement is at the end of its lifespan. The construction, which will upgrade the culvert, improve the roadway, and increase safety, will occur during the dry season to minimize any potential impacts to the environment or wildlife. It is anticipated that the roadway will reopen in December 2016. “Along with engineers and designers, we searched for alternatives to a complete road closure, but due to environmental concerns surrounding the creek, it isn’t feasible to keep the road open during construction,” said Gary Huisingh, Public Works Director for the City of Dublin. “We will be working to get this important construction done with the least amount of impact to local residents and commuters, and will make every effort to reduce the construction window as much as possible. We appreciate everyone’s patience as we improve the road and make it a safer thoroughfare.”
