CITY OF DUBLIN RECEIVES A CITY LIVABILITY AWARD FROM THE U.S. CONFERENCE OF MAYORS

DUBLIN, Calif., June 9, 2018 – The City of Dublin has received an Honorable Mention Award at the 2018 City Livability Awards Program during the U.S. Conference of Mayors’ 86th Annual Meeting in Boston, Massachusetts. The award recognizes mayoral leadership in developing and implementing programs that improve the quality of life in America’s cities. This year’s winners were selected from a pool of over 150 applicants. Dublin Mayor David Haubert was on hand to accept the award for the Dublin City Council and the City of Dublin.

The Conference of Mayors City Livability Program, sponsored by Waste Management, Inc., honors mayors and their city governments for developing programs that enhance the quality of life in urban areas. Dublin was awarded for its Valor Crossing project, a 66-unit affordable housing apartment complex that was built for active military and their families, as well as veterans who have served our country.

“I am proud to accept the City Livability Award on behalf of the City of Dublin,” said Mayor David Haubert. “The Valor Crossing project was a special one in Dublin. We are home to Camp Parks Reserve Forces Training Area – a military base which helped transform Dublin from a rural community to the thriving city that it is today. We are proud of this relationship, which is why we were so committed to providing affordable, quality housing and support services for those who have served our country.”

Established in 1979, the City Livability Awards are given annually to 18 mayors and their cities – a first place award, four Outstanding Achievement Awards, and four Honorable Mention Awards for cities under 100,000 population, and a first-place award, four Outstanding Achievement Awards, and four Honorable Mention Awards for cities of 100,000 or more residents.
