EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Mayor called this special meeting for the City Council to consider flying the rainbow flag at City Hall for one day during the month of June 2019.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Provide direction on whether to fly the rainbow flag at City Hall for one day during the month of June 2019.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

DESCRIPTION:

At its February 19, 2019 meeting, the City Council requested that Staff bring back two items for consideration – a proclamation for LGBTQ Pride Month and the flying of the rainbow flag at City Hall during the month of June.

At its May 21, 2019 meeting, the City Council proclaimed it LGBTQ Pride Month in Dublin. As part of that item, the City Council considered the flying the rainbow flag at City Hall during the month of June. Councilmember Kumagai's motion to fly the flag for one day (June 1, 2019) failed on a vote of 2-3. Under Item 9 at the same meeting, Councilmember Josey requested staff return with a flag policy and the City Council concurred.

As part of the Regular City Council meeting of June 4, 2019, being held concurrently with this special meeting, Staff is presenting the City Council with a proposed Outdoor Flag Display Policy for its consideration. The proposed policy includes language that would allow a Councilmember to request that the City Council authorize the flying of commemorative flags at City Hall.

At this time, Staff is seeking direction on the request from Councilmember Kumagai to fly the rainbow flag at City Hall, for one day in the month of June 2019 (as part of his amended request on May 21). Should it decide to fly the flag, the City Council should adopt a motion that identifies a specific date in its motion.
