


DEMONSTRATED BENEFITS OF REGIONAL MODEL

CITY OF DUBLIN FIRE SERVICES CONTRACT

- **Performance based contract**
- **Contract initiated in 1997**
 - **\$11.79 MM in FY 15/16**
 - **Current contract expires June 2032**
- **Service levels are determined by the City through contract**
- **Fire Suppression, Fire Prevention, Disaster Preparedness, Administration**


DIRECT + SHARED ALLOCATED COST

Response time standard: on scene within 5 minutes of starting the response, 90.4% of the time.


EARTHQUAKES IN THE BAY AREA
