# **DUBLIN POLICE SERVICES**

## **HISTORICAL FACTS**

- **On February 2, 1982 the City of Dublin incorporated and began contracting Law Enforcement Services with the Alameda County Sheriff's Office.**
- **The Sheriff at the time was Glenn Dyer and the City Manager was Richard Ambrose.**
- **The amount of the original contract was \$1,114,442.00**
- **The City was 4.1 square miles at the time and the population was 14,520.**

## TODAY

- **The City of Dublin has grown significantly since 1982.**
- **The Sheriff is now Gregory J. Ahern and the City Manager is Chris Foss.**
- **The current contract is \$17,000,000**
- **The City is now 14.59 square miles and the population is 53,746.**

- **Dublin Police Services is currently staffed with:**


A Total Staff of 61

# **DUBLIN POLICE SERVICES**

## **ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE**

- **The Sheriff's Office Commander assigned to Dublin Police Services serves as the Chief of Police and within the Sheriff's Office, reports to the Assistant Sheriff of Law Enforcement Services.**
- **Within the City of Dublin, the Commander/Chief reports to the City Manager to ensure that Dublin Police Services remains committed to the priorities established by the Mayor and City Council to ensure that we meet the needs of our citizens.**

# REASONS TO CONTRACT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES


## Financial Advantages

- Automatic replacement for injured/sick officers over 10 days
- City is provided with fully trained/experienced officers
- Sheriff pays to train Officers/Academy

## Increased Level of Service

- Additional officers are immediately available in the event of a major incident in Dublin.
- Priority access to the Sheriff's Office Specialized Units

# INVESTIGATIONS



- **The investigations division is responsible for conducting follow-up investigations with the goal of identifying and arresting the person(s) responsible for alleged crimes.**
- **They investigate:**
  - **Crimes Against Persons**
  - **Property Crimes**
  - **Forgeries**
  - **Auto Thefts**
  - **Narcotics/Vice Operations (Craig's List Operations)**

# INVESTIGATIONS

## CONDUCTS COMPLICATED INVESTIGATIONS

- On Tuesday, May 10, 2016, about 5:40 a.m., Dublin Police responded to a report of a carjacking which just occurred in the area of Positano Parkway and La Strada Drive. When units arrived they discovered the 33 year-old victim was driving his vehicle in the area when he was struck from behind by the suspect vehicle. Three suspects armed with handguns approached the victim on foot and forcibly pushed him into the passenger seat of the vehicle. The victim was driven in his vehicle a short distance away where he was robbed of his belongings including a large sum of cash and then released. The three suspects then drove away stealing the victim's vehicle.
- A broadcast with a description of the victim vehicle and suspect vehicle was disseminated to surrounding law enforcement agencies. Units from the Alameda County Sheriff's Office located the victim vehicle as it drove westbound on I580. A traffic enforcement stop was attempted, however the suspects driving the victim vehicle refused to stop and a pursuit was initiated. The pursuit ended when the suspects crashed into a parked car in the area of Bancroft Avenue and 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the City of Oakland. Three suspects were taken into custody shortly after the crash. The victim's stolen property and handguns were recovered from the scene.
- Arrested were 43 year old, Nhat Luons, 31 year-old Carlos Coronel, 33 year-old Victorio Jimenez. All three were booked into Santa Rita Jail on charges of carjacking, robbery, possession of a firearm, evading, and numerous other charges.
- Detectives are following-up on leads that the victim was traveling home after gambling at a bay area casino.

# PATROL OPERATIONS

- **6 Patrol Officers and 1 Watch Sergeant on any given shift**
  - Two Watch Commanders covering 12:00 am to 12:00 pm
  - Day shift may include Traffic Officers, Investigations Staff, SRO, Crime Prevention Staff
- **1 officer to 1,000 population**
- **Respond to calls for service**
- **Self initiated activity**
  - Traffic enforcement, patrol checks, follow up, citizen contacts, business checks, foot patrols

# TRAFFIC UNIT

- The traffic unit's mission is to enforce traffic laws to ensure all drivers will be safe on the streets of Dublin.
- The officers not only enforce traffic regulations, but also investigate vehicle accidents that occur within the boundaries of the city.


