DUBLIN POLICE SERVICES

- The City of Dublin has contracted with the ACSO for police services since incorporation on February 1, 1982.
- The Sheriff's Office Commander assigned to Dublin Police Services serves as the Chief of Police and within the Sheriff's Office, reports to the Assistant Sheriff of Law Enforcement Services.
- Within the City of Dublin, the Chief reports to the City Manager to ensure that Dublin Police Services remains committed to the priorities established by the Mayor and City Council to ensure that we meet the needs of our citizens.



DUBLIN POLICE SERVICES

- DPS has 55 sworn, 4 Sheriff's Technicians, and 4 professional staff. Two additional officers are proposed in FY 2018-19.
- FY 2017-18 Budget: \$18.3 million



Most commonly charged felonies are:

Theft, Burglaries (Auto and Residential) and Drugs / Narcotics

Most commonly charged misdemeanors are:

Theft, Drugs / Narcotics and Drunk Driving

** There has been an uptick in property crimes where the police have been unable to identify the suspects.*

CREATION OF SPECIAL PROSECUTION UNIT

- District Attorney's Office is assigning two fulltime Deputy District Attorneys
- A fulltime District Attorney Inspector to staff the unit.
- Crime Analyst
- The attorneys and the inspector will work in coordination with local law enforcement agencies, property crimes detectives, and asset protection specialists to identify and link similar criminal activity taking place in multiple locations. The Special Prosecution Unit will identify the groups and individuals committing these crimes and bring those responsible to justice while seeking restitution for victims.

HOW SPECIAL PROSECUTION UNIT WILL WORK

- Work with Law Enforcement throughout Alameda County
- District Attorney's Special Prosecution Unit will partner with local law enforcement throughout Alameda County as well as corporate retail asset protection to better coordinate efforts in combating these crimes.

- Burglaries




DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S JUSTICE ACADEMY

DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S JUSTICE ACADEMY


- Dublin High School DAJA participants:




