



Rolling Hills A, B, and C, Dan Dykes, 2004

“Rolling Hills” are a set of three bus shelters designed by Dan Dykes, fabricated in stainless steel. They have two main seating elements. The main area is a traditional, rectangular shelter with sides made of perforated steel sheets. The second being a circular seat around a stainless-steel pillar with a decorative top. Both seats are made of flagstone tile connected by a curving stainless steel roof. These bus shelters are located at Village Parkway north of Amador Valley Boulevard (east side of street); Village Parkway north of Brighton Drive (east side of street); and Amador Valley Boulevard east of Regional Street (north side of street) on the westbound direction. Dan Dykes is a site-sensitive sculptor who works in a variety of media, including stone, bronze and stainless steel. His work synthesizes various forms of nature, fusing diverse images to capture the vibrancy of life. He is a recognized master of metal fabrication and has traveled nationally, teaching for the International Sculpture Conference.
