

Additional Funding for PPP & EDIL Programs

PPP Funding to Resume on Monday, 4/27

This week, Congress passed another round of funding for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL). The Enhancement Act appropriated additional funding for both programs including to set-aside a portion of the PPP funds for smaller banks and credit unions (specifically, community financial institutions as well as credit unions and FDIC-insured banks with consolidated assets of less than \$10 billion).

Interested business owners are encouraged to apply to these federal programs as soon as possible given the limited funding.

Paycheck Protection Program:

Business owners apply for a PPP loan through participating lenders, so check with your lender if they have resumed accepting applications.

Economic Injury Disaster Loans:

Business owners can apply for an EIDL (and the EIDL Advance) directly through the Small Business Administration (SBA). At the time of this writing, the SBA has not announced when they will resume accepting applications for EIDL and EIDL Advances. It is recommended that business owners use the SBA online application portal instead of mailing in an application for faster processing.

Main Street Lending Program

The Federal Reserve has announced it is establishing a Main Street Lending Program to support lending to small and medium-sized businesses that were in good financial standing before the COVID-19 pandemic. This program will be offering loans between \$1 million to \$150 million to businesses with up to 10,000 employees or \$2.5 billion in 2019 revenue. Banks are not currently taking applications, however, the Federal Reserve is expected to release additional guidance on the loan application and bank underwriting requirements shortly.
