# **Applying for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL)**

The Small Business Administration (SBA) has not yet announced when they will resume accepting applications for EIDL and EIDL Advances. However, it is recommended that business owners interested in applying should prepare now so they can apply as soon as the application portal reopens on the SBA's website. The more complete the application, the more efficient the process. So, take your time and make sure the application is complete. If it is



incomplete, you will be notified what is missing, and you fall back in the queue. Receiving a loan is on a first-come, first-served basis.

Trusted partners such as the Alameda County Small Business Development Center are

available to provide free assistance including helping business owners prepare for the SBA EIDL application process.

#### Regarding the EIDL Program:

- There is no cost to apply.
- The maximum loan amount is \$2 million (the maximum unsecured loan amount is \$25,000).
- There is no obligation to take the loan, if offered.
- Primary criteria for determining the loan amount and terms include acceptable credit history and your ability to repay the loan.
- As part of the application, you will need to define the business' loss in comparison to its 2019 operations/financials. Losses will be compared to a 12-month period prior the effective incident period starting on January 31, 2020.

#### **SBA Express Bridge Loan Program**

This program enables small businesses who currently have a business relationship with an SBA Express Lender to access up to \$25,000 quickly. Pre-established SBA Express Lenders include:

# **Give Your Input: California Recovery Roadmap Survey**


