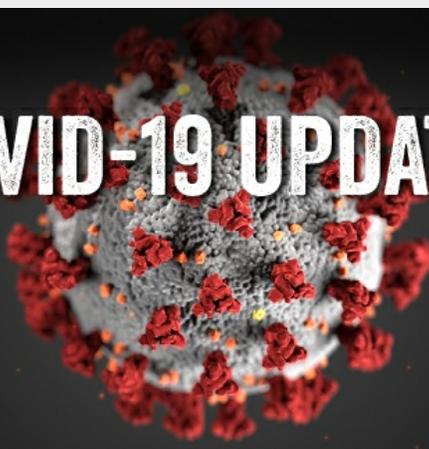

## Special Notice to Dublin Businesses

April 29, 2020

### Regional Shelter-in-Place Orders Extended in Bay Area Through May 31

On April 29, 2020, the Public Health Officers of the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara as well as the City of Berkeley **extended the shelter in place orders through May 31** while easing some restrictions.

While efforts taken to reduce the spread of COVID-19 have been cautiously effective, local health officers say that the risk to public health remains significant and cautioned that reducing restrictions too quickly could lead to a substantial resurgence of COVID-19.

The Order allows a limited number of additional Essential Businesses and certain lower risk Outdoor Businesses to resume operating as of May 4, 2020.

*Note: Where there are differences between the Alameda County Health Officer's order and the State's order, everyone must follow the stricter restrictions.*

### As of Monday, May 4, the following businesses will be allowed to resume:

- All construction projects that follow the Construction Project Safety Protocols stated in the Order (available on Alameda County Public Health Department's [website](#));
- All real estate transactions (with restrictions on open houses and limited tours);
- Childcare, summer camps, and other educational or recreational

institutions or programs providing care or supervision for children of all ages that enable owners, employees, volunteers, and contractors for Essential Businesses, Essential Governmental Functions, Outdoor Businesses, or Minimum Basic Operations to work as allowed under the new Order;

- Outdoor businesses such as nurseries, landscaping, gardeners and agriculture that normally operated outdoors prior to the shelter-in-place orders; and
- Certain shared outdoor recreational facilities can re-open for use, however, recreational facilities that involve shared equipment or physical contact remain closed.

### **Public or private gatherings of any size will remain prohibited:**

- Bars and restaurants continue to be restricted to take-out service only, even if they have outdoor seating.
- Playgrounds, picnic areas, gyms, dog parks, and other shared spaces that do not permit physical distancing or have high-touch equipment must remain closed.
- Funerals are limited to 10 people.

### **Open Businesses Must Create or Update Social Distancing Protocol:**

All businesses operating in the County must update or create a Social Distancing Protocol to reflect new requirements specified in the current order.
