

Special Notice to Dublin Businesses

June 11, 2020

Deadline to Apply for Paycheck Protection Program Loan Approaching Soon

The Paycheck Protection Program is a loan designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep their workers on the payroll. Businesses with 500 or fewer employees can apply, including nonprofits, veterans organizations, Tribal business concerns, sole proprietorships, self-employed individuals, and independent contractors.



You can apply through an existing SBA 7(a) lender or through any federally insured depository institution, federally insured credit union, and Farm Credit System institution that is participating.

Your lender must process your application and submit it to the Small Business Administration (SBA) by June 30, 2020. Since processing times may vary by lender, you are encouraged to apply as soon as possible if you are interested in this program.

Update on Alameda County's Great Plates Delivered Program

Alameda County is participating in "Great Plates Delivered (GPD)," a Federal, State and County funded program designed to provide home-delivered meals to older Californians from area restaurants and food vendors. Recently, the State announced that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) **has extended the time period for the Great Plates Delivered program to July 10, 2020.**

Alameda County has partnered with GoGoGrandparent to administer the Alameda County GPD program and coordinate with food providers to deliver the meals, if

possible, within a ten-mile radius of the older adult's residence.

Restaurants and other food providers (farmers, food kitchens or caterers) interested in participating may submit their interest to the State via this online [interest form](#). GoGoGrandparent will use the information provided to confirm eligibility.

Note: All restaurants that have already submitted are currently being vetted and do not need to resubmit their interest.

Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) Round 4 Grants Now Open

Verizon, Sam's Club, U.S. Bank, and other corporations have contributed to LISC's Rapid Relief and Resiliency Fund to offer Small Business Relief Grants for small businesses facing immediate financial pressure because of Covid-19.

The Round 4 application period is now open. Applications must be submitted by **June 17th**, 11:59 p.m. (ET). Grant information and FAQs are available online.

Main Street Lending Program

The U.S. Federal Reserve Board has provided more information for lenders and borrowers about the expansion of the Main Street Lending Program under the CARES Act. The Main Street Lending Program is designed to provide support to small and medium-sized businesses across the United States during the current period of financial strain by supporting the provision of credit to such businesses. The Program includes:

- the Main Street New Loan Facility,
- the Main Street Priority Loan Facility, and
- the Main Street Expanded Loan Facility.

The Board lowered the minimum loan amount, raised the maximum loan limit, adjusted the principal repayment schedule to begin after two years, and extended the term to five years, providing borrowers with greater flexibility in repaying the loans.

Federal Tax Deadline Reminder

The Internal Revenue Service reminds taxpayers that estimated tax payments for tax year 2020, originally due April 15 and June 15, are now **due July 15**. This means that any individual or corporation that has a quarterly estimated tax payment due has until July 15 to make that payment without penalty.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Treasury Department and the Internal Revenue Service are providing special tax filing and payment relief to individuals and businesses. This relief applies to federal income tax returns and tax payments (including tax on self-employment income) otherwise due April 15, 2020. This relief does not apply to state tax payments or deposits or payments of any other type of federal tax.
