New Alameda County Health Order Allows for Limited Outdoor Activities

The Alameda County Health Officer has issued a new Health Order, to go into effect on **Friday, August 28**, which will allow for the resumption of limited outdoor activities and services. The Order allows for the reopening of outdoor swimming pools, in addition to outdoor hair salons, nail salons, barbershops, waxing services, skin care, and non-medical massages. However, services that require a client to remove their face covering, as well as eyebrow threading, waxing, and eyelash treatments, are still prohibited. Tattoo, piercing, and electrolysis businesses are also not allowed to resume at this time.

Wineries in Alameda County may offer outdoor tastings by appointment, without needing to provide food. However, this does not apply to bars, breweries, pubs, or brewpubs.

All businesses must complete a Site-Specific Protection Plan, and protocols and procedures to protect customers and employees from COVID-19 must be in place prior to reopening.

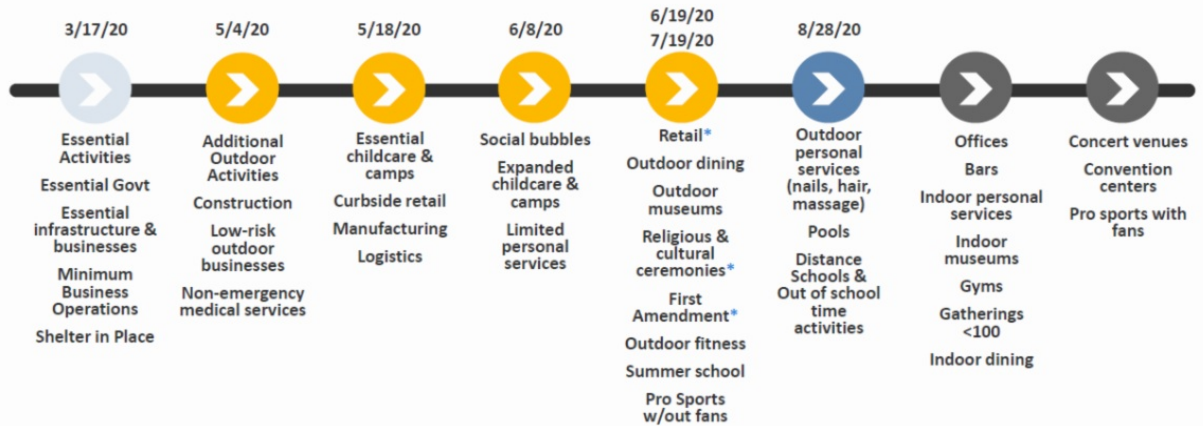

State Guidance Regarding Barbering and Cosmetology Services

With the announcement that certain outdoor personal services can take place in Alameda County starting on Friday, August 28, salon owners should read the information issued by the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology regarding outside services.

Reminder: If the County's Health Order or Operational Guidance is different than the State's, the stricter regulation must be followed. This information is available in multiple languages.
