Alameda County Health Order to Allow for Indoor Operation of Barbershops and Hair Salons

The latest Health Order, issued by the Alameda County Public Health Department on Wednesday, September 2, now allows for the indoor operation of barbershops and hair salons and additional outdoor dance classes and non-contact fitness classes as described in greater detail below. As a reminder, Alameda County is in the Purple Tier of the State's new color-coded, four-tier [Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#).



The following businesses are allowed to operate in Alameda County starting on **Friday, September 4, 2020**:

- **Hair salons and barbershops** in accordance with the [guidance](#) (PDF).

The County also clarified that the following are allowed to operate:

- **Retail stores** with a 25% capacity limit, and grocery stores with a 50% capacity limit. (Limits are aligned to recent, more restrictive State measures.)
- **Indoor malls** with a 25% capacity restriction and continued mandatory closure of food courts and public congregation points. (Limits are aligned to recent, more restrictive State measures.)
- **Outdoor dance classes** as part of outdoor non-contact fitness classes.
- **Outdoor Mini-golf, batting cages, driving rages and kart racing**, as allowed by the [State's Family Entertainment Center Guidance](#) (PDF).

Note: Shared play structures continue to be closed, including bounce houses, ball pits and playgrounds.

Local Health Orders can be more restrictive than the State Orders, and other activities that may be allowed in the Purple Tier by the State are still not permitted in Alameda County at this time.
