

California Will Align with CDC Mask Guidance on June 15, 2021

Earlier this week, the [California Department of Public Health](#) (CDPH) announced that California will keep existing mask guidance in place until **Tuesday, June 15, 2021** when it aims to fully reopen the economy.

On May 19, 2021, the Association of Bay Area Health Officials, including the Alameda County Health Officer, issued a [statement](#) strongly supporting the CDPH's strategy to continue with current masking guidance until June 15, when the State will align with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) updated masking guidance.

With almost half of California's population over age 16 fully vaccinated, and nearly 65 percent have received at least one dose of vaccine, great progress has been made across the state in vaccinating eligible residents against COVID-19.

Restaurant Revitalization Fund Update

The application portal for the Small Business Administration (SBA) Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) remains open, as the program still has potential funding available for eligible establishments with 2019 annual revenue of not more than \$50,000.



Eligible establishments that meet this revenue standard are encouraged to apply through SBA-recognized point-of-sale vendors or directly via the SBA online

application portal.

In addition, SBA Administrator Isabella Casillas Guzman created two additional funding allocations to ensure the smallest of the small restaurants and other eating establishments such as food trucks and carts get the aid needed:

1. \$500 million for applicants with 2019 gross receipts less than \$50,000; and
2. \$4 billion for applicants with 2019 gross receipts between \$500,000 and \$1,500,000.

Toolkit for Employers Helps Make COVID-19 Vaccinations for Workers More Convenient

The State has created an [Employer Vaccination Toolkit](#), which will ease the process for employers to request a workplace clinic or local provider partner, making COVID-19 vaccines even more accessible for their employees.

The Employer Vaccination Toolkit provides employers with vaccine education materials, information on COVID-19 Supplemental Paid Sick Leave and other guidance for employees, and an [online form](#) to request vaccination support.

Employers interested in requesting group appointments at nearby providers or setting up a mobile or pop-up vaccination clinic at their workplace must complete an online form. A representative will follow up within three business days, and requests will be filled as resources allow. There is no financial cost to the employer.
