RAIN AND STORM ADVISORY

Dublin Braces for Heavy Rains and High Winds



Rain is on the way as the Bay Area sits at the southern tip of a strong storm already moving through the North Bay. Dublin experienced heavy rain and wind gusts on Friday and Saturday, November 22 and 23, which are anticipated to be followed by scattered showers into Monday.

The sandbag station at the City of Dublin Corporation Yard located at 5709 Scarlett Court is open and free sandbags are available for Dublin residents and businesses, with a limit of 10 bags per household or business.

- For damaged power lines or electrical hazards, call 911 without delay.
- For power outages, call PG&E at 800-743-5000.

WINTER STORM PREPARATION

Dublin Maintenance Crews Prepare for Storm



While storms may be seasonal, our preparation never stops. In Dublin, we know that effective storm prevention and response requires a year-round commitment. The City's maintenance team inspects and maintains drainage systems, ensuring storm drains, culverts, retention basins, and roadways are clear and ready to handle heavy rainfall. We regularly trim and clear around infrastructure to help reduce risks from fallen trees and debris during severe weather. Crews also clear rooftops, gutters, and downspouts on City buildings to prevent leaks. We are committed to ensuring that City infrastructure remains safe and reliable, no matter the weather.

DUBLIN POLICE SERVICES GRANTS

Office of Traffic Safety Grants



Dublin Police Services has received a \$100,000 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety to enhance traffic enforcement and education programs aimed at reducing serious injuries and fatalities on Dublin roads. Running through September 2025, the grant will support initiatives such as DUI checkpoints, distracted driving enforcement, operations targeting

risky behaviors affecting pedestrians and bicyclists, and efforts to address crash-causing violations like speeding and running red lights. It also includes community education, collaborative enforcement with neighboring agencies, and officer training in areas like impaired driving detection.

Dublin Police Services also received a \$24,800 grant from the Office of Traffic Safety for the implementation of a new electronic crash and citation data reporting system. The new system will allow Dublin Police Services to focus on data-driven strategies that are concentrated on high-priority traffic areas within Dublin, thereby improving public safety on community roads.

- Approved a Commercial Façade Improvement Grant Program agreement

between the City of Dublin and Dobos Stacey S Tr & McCloskey Kenneth D Tr, Etal.

- Approved an Outdoor Operations Grant Program agreement between the City of Dublin and 7400 Amador, LLC.
- Approved the agreement for long-term encroachment for landscape features with Tract 8677, PA-4 The DC (Dublin Centre); and adopted the resolution ordering the annexation of The DC (Dublin Centre) into the Dublin Ranch Street Lighting District 1999-1.
- Authorized the City Manager to approve contract change orders with Goodfellow Bros. California, LLC, Iron Horse Nature Park and Open Space, Phase 1 Project, CIP No. PK0422
- Conducted a public hearing and approved forming City of Dublin Community Facilities District No. 2024-1 (Dublin Centre); authorized a limit on bonded indebtedness for the district, calling for a special mailed ballot election; declared election results; and conducted related proceedings for City of Dublin Community Facilities District No. 2024-1 (Dublin Centre).
