## CURBSIDE HOLIDAY TREE PICKUP BEGINS NEXT WEEK

Turn Your Tree Into Compost



Starting **Monday, January 6**, Amador Valley Industries

will collect holiday trees curbside on your regular collection day through January 31 (for single-family homes).

Other disposal options include:

- Bring your tree to the Dublin Sports Grounds parking lot and place it into the holiday tree dumpsters between January 3 and January 31.
- Cut your tree into pieces and place it in your green compost cart along with yard trimmings, food scraps, and food-soiled paper.

Make sure your tree is free of flocking and tinsel to ensure it can be composted.

## DUI CHECKPOINT RESULTS

**Dublin Police Services Leads Successful Safety Operation**



On December 20, Dublin Police Services Traffic Division conducted a DUI checkpoint in front of Dublin Sports Grounds, screening nearly 800 drivers between 8:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. with support from the Alameda County Sheriff's Office. Two arrests were made after drivers committed multiple traffic violations to avoid the checkpoint.

The event was funded by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

## BUILDING PERMIT ISSUED FOR NEW SENIOR AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY

**174-Bed Facility To Include 38 Memory Care Units**



South Bay Partners, LLC has been issued a building permit to construct a senior and assisted living facility at 5751 Arnold Road. The project includes a two-story, 155,000 square-foot building with 152 units, including

114 assisted living units and 38 memory care units, for a total of 174 beds. This project will also include common area amenities such as two courtyards, and associated site, frontage, and landscape improvements. Construction is anticipated to take approximately 18 months to complete.
