PUBLIC ART: IT'S LIKE HAVING A GALLERY, RIGHT IN YOUR OWN BACKYARD

One of the things that makes Dublin special is our wonderful collection of public art. The City owns and maintains more than 30 art pieces on City property for the public's enjoyment. Dublin's Public Art Ordinance calls for large private developers to set aside up to a half percentage of the project's construction value to install public art on their properties, or support the City's Public Art Fund.

ARACHNICAT. COLIN SELIG. 2020

Arachnicat is a whimsical biomorphic sculpture climbing up out of the adjacent creek to explore Clover Park. Arachnicat is a playful, brightly colored focal point for the park which can be enjoyed visually from multiple angles at ground level as well as from the switchback trail and hillside above. Arachnicat is designed for tactile human interaction. Incorporated between the legs are three seating surfaces, allowing pedestrians and bicyclists to sit and relax. The sculpture is extremely eco-friendly since it's made entirely from repurposed scrap steel propane tanks, regionally sourced in the Central Valley.
