DOGS OF DUBLIN, TELLART, 2020

Dogs of Dublin is located at Dougherty Hills Dog Park, 6510 Amador Valley Boulevard, in Dublin. This is a colorful and community-generated art piece. The work consists of a series of brightly colored laser-cut steel silhouettes of dogs, including many who actually use the park. The silhouettes are arranged around the park's perimeter fencing. Their coloring varies, following an ombre pattern inspired by the colors seen at dusk over the park's nearby hills. Eighty silhouettes line almost 500 feet of fence line along Amador Valley Boulevard.
