About The City of Dublin was incorporated in 1982 and currently has a population of approximately 50,000 residents, with more than 2,000 businesses employing approximately 19,000 people. The City of Dublin promotes and practices environmental sustainability on many levels, through energy, waste, and water quality and conservation programs. The City organizes creek cleanups, Dublin Pride week, and community outreach at the Dublin Farmer's Market and other City events. Dublin has a <u>Climate Action Plan</u>, which includes greenhouse gas inventories for 2005 and 2010. In 2013 the City created an <u>Energy Action Plan</u> with the assistance of Chevron Energy Solutions.

Achievements

- 700 kw of solar panels installed at seven City facilities, including the Library and City Hall parking lots, Shannon Community Center, Senior Center and three Dublin Fire stations
- LED lights installed at streetlights, parks and traffic signals throughout the City
- Irrigation improvements made throughout the City
- Residential and commercial recycling and composting programs in place for over ten years
- Annual Hazardous Waste and Compost Give-Away Event
- Transit-oriented developments built
- Bike racks new required at all new developments
- Named a "Tree City USA"
- Centralized and automated sprinklers in place
- Electric vehicle charging stations at the Dublin Library
- Added Sustainability element and Complete Street Policy to General Plan
